

BCSA Versatility Program - “VCH” Worksheet

Versatility Champion Requirements: Each Versatility level (V, VX, VCH) is a separate award with separate requirements. Use only the chart below to determine your dog’s eligibility for the “VCH” award.

To qualify for the “VCH”:

1. The dog must have earned “V” and “VX” awards.
2. The dog must have a minimum of an HI or equivalent in the area of Herding.
3. The dog must have 2 titles from the area titled “Exemplary” (shown as shaded) from different areas.
4. If the dog’s herding title is one listed in the Exemplary area, this title may also be counted as one of the two required Exemplary titles.
